

ranz was the son of John Anderwald and Barbara Lippok. He married Elizabeth Adamietz, and they had 10 children in Poland. In 1854 they sailed for Texas on the *Weser*. The Franz Anderwald family was one of the 16 original Silesian families that settled in Bandera in 1855 (Bandera County History Book Committee, 1986, p. 152; Bandera County Historical Commission, 1993, p. 2). They lived in a two-room log house located behind St. Joseph's School near the Old Mill Dam (Bandera County Historical Commission, 1993, p. 2).

Franz, a carpenter and shingle maker, worked at the local sawmill operated by John James and Charles de Montel, founders of Bandera (Hunter, 1953, pp. 2, 77). Franz was also a farmer, and in 1870 his assets included 10 acres of improved land, 10 unimproved acres, farm implements and machinery valued at \$25, 2 horses, 4 milk cows, 15 other cattle, 75 bushels of Indian corn, 10 bushels of sweet potatoes, 100 pounds of butter, a ton of hay, and \$38 in animals slaughtered or sold for slaughter. The cash value of his farm was estimated at \$50, and the estimated value of all farm products was \$118 (U.S. Agricultural Census, Bandera County, 1870, line 10).

After residing in Bandera for over 30 years, Franz died in 1887. Within one week of his death, Elizabeth also passed away. They were both buried in the St. Stanislaus Cemetery in Bandera, Texas.

Św. Michała of Rozmierz



This church originated in the 15th century. It was enlarged in the 17th century and again in the 19th century, always maintaining the integrity of the individual architectural styles. Thirteen families in *Silesian Profiles* had baptisms and / or marriages recorded at Św. Michała in Rozmierz: Anderwald, Anioł, Długosz, Gaurzel, Kałka, Kasperczyk, Kolibaba, Michalski, Mroz, Mutz, Pierdoła, Ploch, and Waczławczyk. Also profiled were Glinka, Hadrion, Jaskoła, Polok, Pyka, Urbanczyk, and Woicik.
