Valentin was the son of Valentin Anioł and Maria Niedworok. Valentin married Josepha Membel, and in 1855 he contracted with the Schüler Agency in Poland for passage to America. He is recorded on the agency list with Josepha, their three-year-old son Jacob, and their infant daughter Marianna. In November it was reported that 700 Polish emigrants from Upper Silesia had journeyed through Breslau before departing for Galveston. This group was "...composed of men, women, and children, all dressed in their national costumes and are represented as an industrious class of people" (Galveston Weekly News, 13 November 1855, 3rd page).

Upon arrival in Texas, the Aniołs were one of 13 original Silesian families that settled in the Martinez Creek / St. Hedwig area in southeastern Bexar County (San Antonio Express, 12 November 1933, section D, p. 1; Dworaczyk, 1936, p. 109; Baker, 1979, p. 182, note 30). By 1866 Valentin owned a 40 -acre farm valued at $\$ 135$, a horse valued at $\$ 12$, and 16 cattle valued at $\$ 64$ (Bexar County Tax Assessments, 1866, p. 2).

Although Valentin died in 1895, his wife lived until 1913. At the time of her death, Josepha was living with one of her daughters at 120 Greeley Street in San Antonio. Her burial was handled by the Zizik Undertaking Company (San Antonio Express, 13 January 1913, p. 7; Zizik Funeral Records, p. 199).
