

eter\*, the son of Simon Kiełbassa, sailed to Texas on the *Hamburg* and the *Enoch Train* with his family in early 1855. Peter and Antonia settled in DeWitt County with six of their children. The Polish community in the area soon organized its parish in 1856, and Peter was remembered as one of the founding members (Przygoda, 1971, p. 57). Peter owned 50 acres of land valued at \$300 (DeWitt County Tax Assessments, 1863, p. 7; 1864, p. 8). Antonia died in 1868, and her burial was recorded at Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Meyersville, Texas.

After Antonia's death, Peter moved to St. Hedwig where his son Ignatz and his daughter and son-in-law, Francisca and Anton Kozub, lived. In 1879 Peter died and was buried in the parish cemetery.

Notes: According to family stories, two children, Ludwiga and Florentina, died at sea; however, no records of their baptisms have been found, and their names did not appear on the ship's manifest.

The first Kiełbassa child, Antonia, married Joseph Jaska on 3 February 1852, in Jemielnica, Poland (Wniebowzięcia NMP, Marriage Records, p. 231, entry #5, LDS Microfilm #0957159).

Another Kiełbassa daughter, Paulina, married John Richter on 24 November 1857 in Panna Maria, Texas (see John Richter profile).

Francisca married Anton Kozub on 16 February 1863 in San Antonio, Texas (see Anton Kozub profile).


<sup>\*</sup> It is important to note that this Peter Kiełbassa was not the brother of Stanislaus Kiełbassa whose parents were Paul Kiełbassa and Ewa Wycisk (see Stanislaus Kiełbassa profile). Additionally, Peter Kiełbassa, the subject of this Profile, should not be confused with Peter, the son of Stanislaus Kiełbassa, about whom much has been written. The latter Peter who was born in 1838 in Świbie, Poland, served in the Civil War, taught school in Panna Maria, and later moved to Illinois.

Antonia's burial record, written in Latin, indicates that she died on June 21, 1868, and was buried on the following day. It states that she was the wife (uxor) of Peter, and her age is given as circa 60. It appears that she was buried in the cemetery at Yorktown (Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic Church, Meyersville, Texas, p. 4, entry #7, LDS Microfilm #0025295).



Prussian Parliament as a "peasant deputy" before immigrating to Texas with his family in 1855 (Baker, 1973, pp. 78-79; 1975a, p. 11; 1979, p. 28, p. 177, note 46; 1982, p. 13). The Kiolbassas first settled in Panna Maria but soon moved west because of the malarial conditions around the new settlement. Although the precise location is not known, it has been recorded that he established a farm and built his house of grooved mesquite blocks, the first of its kind in the area. Soon, though, Stanislaus moved his family again. They settled on Atascosa Creek, six miles south of Castroville. Family tradition relates that they were treated kindly by local Indians because the Kiolbassas left milk and eggs for them each evening (Vivian Kiolbassa, personal communication).

A drought and subsequent crop failure soon forced them to move to San Antonio in 1858. A series of residences were located on Villita, Presa, and South Alamo streets and, finally, on North Street. It was on North Street that Stanislaus is reported to have died on May 10, 1862 (*A Twentieth Century History of Southwest Texas*, 1907, pp. 189-190; Dworaczyk, 1936, pp. 97-98; Baker, 1973, p. 80). Confirming this death date was not possible; San Fernando burial records from this time period were destroyed in a fire, and his tombstone has not been located.

Tax rolls for 1867 indicate that Franciszka lived on South Street and owned two lots valued at \$500. A later city directory gives her address as 305 South Street between Matagorda and Indianola Streets (*Morrison & Fourmy's General Directory of the City of San Antonio, 1887-88*, p. 203). Franciszka died in 1889 and was buried at St. Michael Cemetery in San Antonio, Texas.

Francisca died on 30 June 1837 when she was seven months old, and she was buried three days later (Burial Records, p. 2, entry #59, LDS Microfilm #2126273).
