homas was the son of Wenceslaus Krawietz and Juliann Glogowsky, and Agnes was the daughter of Paul Schygula and Anna Stass. Thomas, Agnes, and five of their children immigrated to Texas in 1855. They were one of 13 original Silesian families that settled in St. Hedwig in southeastern Bexar County (*San Antonio Express*, 12 November 1933, section D, p. 1; Dworaczyk, 1936, p. 109; Baker, 1979, p. 182, note 30). In 1866 Thomas owned a 20-acre farm valued at \$105, a horse worth \$15, and 10 cattle valued at \$50 (Bexar County Tax Assessments, 1866, p. 55).

Thomas and Agnes Krawietz, Martin and Francisca Pierdolla, Joseph and Francisca Michalski, and Anton and Maria Tudyk were the parishioners who donated property for the second church at St. Hedwig. Father Adolf Bakanowski, the superior of the Resurrectionists in Texas, blessed the cornerstone in 1868 and formally recognized the generosity of the families who donated land (Dworaczyk, 1936, p. 112). Yet it was not until 1871 that those four couples travelled to San Antonio to legally transfer property ownership to the church (Bexar County Deed Records, 7 February 1871, Volume W1, p. 65).

St. Hedwig was the Krawietz family's only home in Texas. Their beloved Annunciation of the BVM Church was the heart of this community. The parish cemetery was the final resting place for both Thomas and Agnes.
