

hillip, son of John Przybysch and Francisca Felux, arrived in Texas in 1854 with the first large group of Silesian immigrants. He married Josepha, the daughter of Anton Jarzumbek and Martina Schmiga, in 1856 (see Anton Jarzumbek profile). Within a few years, he erected one of the first stone houses in Panna Maria (Baker, 1979, p. 43). This structure was located west of the church, and the walls were still standing in 1936 (Dworaczyk, 1936, p. 21).

During the Civil War, Phillip served for several months with Captain James P. King's Company for Karnes County, Third Frontier District, Texas State Troops (Texas State Archives, Record Group 401). In 1869 Phillip appeared in the courthouse at Helena with fellow Silesian immigrants, Frank Manka and Anton Jendrush, to declare his intentions to become a United States citizen (Karnes County Commissioner's Court Minutes, Volume A, p. 70, entry #220). Two years later, Phillip exercised his rights as a citizen by registering to vote (Karnes County Voter Registration Records, 30 September 1871, p. 427).

In 1877 Phillip donated \$100 to the new church at Panna Maria (Dworaczyk, 1936, p. 51). Phillip and Josepha appeared together in Karnes County census records for the next 30 years. They are both buried in the Nativity of the BVM Cemetery at Cestohowa.
